

The Old Port of Montreal Corporation (OPMC) is looking for a commercial tenant to operate a space currently occupied by the Bonsecours Pavilion to complete the area with its other nearby attractions and businesses.

USAGE

The OPMC is offering the opportunity to various proponents to present a development project that could include an attraction and/or restaurant, or any project relevant to the use or replacement of the current Bonsecours Pavilion building. No bar-terrace occupancy will be permitted.

AVAILABILITY

Space for rent is available now.

SPACE FOR RENT

The Bonsecours Pavilion building has a surface area of 7,500sq.ft. and is in a 36,000sq.ft. area. See attached plan.

The entire space is modular and can be expanded to suit the proponent's project, it can also include a portion of the Bonsecours basin. The building is offered on an "as is" basis, including existing and available utilities: electricity, water, sanitary drainage. The building can be renovated or rebuilt as required, at the proponent's expense.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Located on a 2.5-kilometer stretch between Old Montreal and the St. Lawrence River, the Old Port of Montréal is a recreational site and is a must-see spot for Montrealers and tourists.

The Old Port of Montreal welcomes an average 6.3 million visitors annually, including 4.5 million during the summer season.

MAJOR ATTRACTIONS

The site is home to renowned attrations such as:

- La Grande Roue de Montréal (observation wheel) ;
- MTL Zipline;
- Montreal Science Center;
- Bota Bota spa-sur-l'eau;
- Voiles en Voiles (aerial adventure courses).

EVENTS

The site's programming is diversified and features numerous cultural, culinary, sporting, and musical events as well as outdoor festivals, including the world-renowned Cirque du Soleil, Igloofest and Jackalope at Jacques-Cartier Quay.

SHOPS NEARBY

On Bonsecours Island, you will find La Grande Roue de Montréal with its bistro/café, Pedal Boats and Train-Train. Nearby, there are 19 boutiques (red containers) and Hangar 16 which is under development for a new annual attraction.

IMPORTANT DETAILS

The Old Port of Montréal Park closes at midnight, and all activities must respect a maximum closing time of 11 p.m.
